So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Motherhood

Text: Luke 1:26-38

Motherhood is a transformative and often contradictory journey (Pro 18:22). It can also be a lonely / difficult experience at times, full of amazing highs, devastating lows and heartache, blending immense love with misgivings for the future. Mary the mother of Jesus was no exception. As a virgin, she could only trust God to carry her through the difficulties ahead of her. Joseph's support, as a God-fearing man, was essential (Matt 1:18-25).

Mary was obedient to the will of God and that should be our position too whenever God calls us. Mary and Joseph were devoted to their children. They lived by example, guiding them in God's ways. We need to be role models for our children (Lk 2:22-24). That includes cultivating the fruit of the spirit in their lives as well as our own (Gal 5:22-25).

Mary knew Jesus and ensured he fulfilled his calling (Jn 2:1-5). She watched him go through immense pain and opposition. With ultimate faith and endurance, she remained strong, trusting that God's will can still be done even in the face of what seemed like the greatest of tragedies, continuing with the disciples in prayer (Acts 1:13-14).

Whatever the circumstances, we must remain prayerful and never give up on our children. God is able to make everything work together for our good (Rom 8:28). We bring our children up in God's ways (Jos 24:15). Through everything that happened around her, Mary remained humble and knew when to intervene (Lk 2:19; Jn 2:5). She was actively involved and so must we be, guiding / influencing them when young.

Bottom line:

Be kind to mothers. They may not be perfect, but they go through a lot. They're unique in bringing new lives into the world, sacrificing their health and sometimes their lives to ensure their children thrive. Today, reach out and appreciate mothers, forgiving them if and when necessary.
