So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

## Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

## Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

## Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### *The Fish Gate*

**Text: Nehemiah 3:3**

The fish gate is the gate of provision. Entrance gates can determine where we end up and must be the right one (Psa 100:4). The Psalmist said he's never seen the righteous forsaken or begging for bread (Psa 37:18-26). We may want to challenge this statement if we've seen faithful and God-fearing Christians begging, but David isn't saying Christians can't be poor.

With the arrogance of youth, we sometimes make absolute statements about our expectations for the future, discarded once faced with reality. The old speak with wisdom informed by their experiences. David was talking from such experiences and we can see the picture of God's divine economy in the scriptures (2 Cor 9:6-11). Jesus fed a multitude and there are many more examples (Matt 14:15-19; Lk 19:28-38; Matt 17:24-27).

This suggests that we're merely stewards of God's resources, including our talent, money and many other gifts in God's economy. When there's a need, we release as needed because the Lord needs it. Sometimes we look to man for help when, forgetting God's the only one who can meet our needs (Phil 4:11-13; 19; 2 Cor 9:10; Isa 25:6; Ob 17-21).

God will send some people to meet your needs. Likewise, he may send you to meet the needs of others. It's Palm Sunday today and a reminder that although Jesus said iniquity shall abound (Matt 24:12), we can take comfort in the fact that Jesus came, became man, lived among us, died and rose so we can be saved (Jn 1:14; 16). God gave us the ultimate gift in his son (Jn 15:13). We can be a channel of blessing to others too.

### **Bottom line:**

Enter through the gate of provision and tie yourself to the economy of heaven because God's able to meet your needs. It may be difficult to explain why some Christians lack, but when we have an understanding of God's ability to provide, we will lack nothing (Psa 37:25).
