Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Can two really work together?

Text: Amos 3:3

When two people walk together, it's either by explicit agreement or they're travelling to the same destination or in the same direction. When an agreement or understanding is missing, there's likely to be clashes, lack of accountability or they may fail to achieve their goals.

However, the underlying concept in Amos 3:3 suggest there should be much more in common. God made it clear that there was a deeper relationship and a fundamental understanding between him and Israel. Therefore, their transgressions cannot go unpunished, based on this premise (Amos 3:2).

Humans are arguably the most intelligent of God's creatures, beautifully and wonderfully made in God's image to be self-sufficient, if we choose (Psa 139:14; Gen 1:27; 11:1-9). That means cooperation will necessarily require tolerance and compromise to determine our success or failure from moment to moment. A workable agreement could yield piece / great promise. The opposite could start a war.

For example, Paul and Barnabas's disagreement on whether John Mark should accompany them on their next missionary journey drove them apart for a while (Acts 15:36-40), although they reconciled later (1 Cor 9:6; 2 Tim 4:11). As Christians, while each of us run individual races and will give account (Rom 14:12), unity and working together is crucial, not only for our own benefit but for others (Heb 10:24-25; Pro 27:17; Rom 1:11-12; Gal 6:2).

God wants us to work together in unity. One reason as Paul puts it is because in Christ, we're one body with many members (1 Cor 12:12-27). So we put aside differences arising from race, culture, religion, ego or self and so on, for the greater good and to fulfil God's purpose. This is because our growth, maturity and resilience depend on how well we can (Eph 4:11-16).

Bottom line:

As individual members of God's body, we're never alone in Christ (Matt 28:20b) and nothing can separate us from God's love (Rom 8:38-39) or from the Holy Spirit (Jn 14:16-17). However, it's a provable fact that we're more powerful and stronger together (Ecc 4:12; Matt 18:19; Psa 133:1-3).
