Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Horse Gate – Part II

Text: Nehemiah 3:28

In the last session on this topic, we concluded that although we're at war, whether we like it or not, we're seated with Christ in heavenly places. Jesus has won the battle (Eph 6:10-13; Col 1:12-14; Rom 12:2; Jn 16:33). Our God is the God of the living and not the dead (Matthew 22:32). We're always alive and not dead, and like David, we will always be victorious (2 Ks 6:8-17).

Stepping out away from our safety in Christ could be a perilous (Jn 17:16-21). Sin can make us lose diplomatic immunity (1 Cor 4:1-5). We've an advocate in Christ who defends us (1 Jn 2:1-2). However, we must be aware of the dangers, because we're not just fighting an individual or the devil (Eph 6:12; 2:2-3; Col 1:12-13). It's more difficult to fight against an institution with its established powers / hierarchies.

To succeed, we need the kingdom of God backing us up. Wrestling places someone in a painful position until they tap out and surrender (Eph 6:12). The serpent was more crafty than Eve, but she was unaware (Gen 3:1). We need to know our enemy is the institution. And sometimes, it may feel like our kingdom prayers are powerless against such enemies, but we're seizing spiritual territories each time.

We fight unseen battles every day and while it may look like we're not winning, know that our prayers are working (Gal 6:9-10; Dan 10:12) because it's not by might or power (Zech 4:6). We're a powerhouse. Know your enemy and know yourself and your authority as God's ambassador (Rom 8:37; 2 Cor 5:20). We can change nations and destinies with our prayers (Js 5:16).

Bottom line:

Like Gideon, there may be battles you're hiding from now because you don't know yourself (Jdgs 6:1; 11-13). Pray that the gifts of God in your life will be stirred up so you can realise how special and that you're a gift for this generation (2 Tim 1:6-7), not to fight for scraps from the enemy.
