So, why don't you set our homepage as one of your **startup page(s)** in your browser now? The following instructions for most of the common browsers may help.

Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God cares more about our inward man

Text: Galatians 4:19-20

Today is Fathers' Day. Ultimately, God is our father and when he started with Adam, in the beginning, his desire was that man will be one with him (Gen 1:26; 3:8-9). Then, God's attention turn to Noah. He commanded him to build an ark. All except Noah and those with him in the ark were destroyed in the flood (Gen 7:1-8:19). By faith Noah became heir of the righteousness of God (Heb 11:7).

Later, salvation was brought to mankind through Abraham and his seed, Jesus Christ (Gal 3:16). Thus, God chose Abraham out of all the people on earth (Deut 39:9; Exo 3:6). Now, he's called us all into the same covenant through his son (Jn 1:11-12). That means we can call him Abba, Father (Rom 8:15; Gal 4:3-6).

God desires that everyone will be saved and anyone willing, saint or sinner, can come to him as they are (2 Pet 3:9; Jn 3:16). That's why Jesus promised to prepare a place for each us (Jn 14:2-3). We can choose to take our place or not, because there's now a separation between those who are God's children and those doomed to condemnation (Matt 25:34-41).

God's able to save to the uttermost those who come to him (Heb 7:25). However, he's more interested in who we're becoming than what we have, as we are transformed into the image of Christ (2 Cor 3:18). We should aim to build with precious stone that will endure. Not with wood that will be destroyed when tested with fire (1 Cor 3:12-13).

The scripture testified about different workings of faith in those patriarchs who left lasting impacts on us (Heb 11:32-40; in context 11:1-40). As the story of David's anointing showed, while men may judge by outward appearance, God examines the state of our heart (1 Sam 16:6-12).

God works in us to will and to do (Phil 2:13) and we need his help to become who he wants us to be. So we must acknowledge him as our source (2 Cor 12:9). The ability to make heaven is not in ourselves. God gives us grace and he will persist until Christ is fully formed in us (Gal 4:19; Rom 12:2 2; Cor 4:16).

Bottom line:

God desires that Christ is formed in us and he's able to keep us from falling (Jude 24). Turn to him today. Lay your heart at his feet. Ask him to purify your inward man and to make your life a testimony of God's perfection (Pro 4:18; Matt 5:48).
