Google Chrome

1. Open the browser and the **Settings** menu (or the **three vertical dots** to the right of the menu bar).
2. Scroll down and click on **Advanced Settings**.
3. Select **Open a specific page or set of pages** under **On Startup**.
4. Select **Set pages** and enter or add <http://rccgbethel.church/>.

Mozilla Firefox

1. Open Firefox. Press **Alt-T** on the keyboard and select **Options** from the drop-down menu or go to **Tools >> Options** from the main menu.
2. In the **Home** section, select **Homepage and new windows** and **Custom URLs...** from the field's drop down.
3. Enter or paste the URL: <http://rccgbethel.church/> or click **Use Current Page** if you are already on our website.

Microsoft Edge

1. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar.
2. Select **Settings** and select **A Specific Page or Pages** from the **Open Microsoft Edge With** section drop down options.
3. Enter <http://rccgbethel.church/>. (Click the Plus sign to add more pages if required).
4. Click the **three horizontal dots** to the right of the top menu bar again to close **Settings** menu.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Finding your place in God

Text: 2 Kings 5:1-5

In today's text, the young girl's name was never revealed. She was an insignificant captive who became a servant and yet, her conception of God proved pivotal in Naaman's healing (2 Kgs 5:2-3). What's your impact where you find yourself? What have you done? Have you found your place in God?

This young girl was used to reveal weaknesses in a system. Know that God predestined you to be exactly where you are today, but how do we react when something challenges our faith in God? Do we renounce save ourselves at God's expense (Matt 16:25). We may all know how God called Abraham to leave his home (Gen 12:1-2), but do we know he delayed and settled in Haran first until God brought him where he wanted him (Acts 7:2-4)?

Abraham's call never expired, so it's never too late for us. Daniel wasn't a priest or an apostle and neither were Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Yet, they found their places in God and in history. There's a place and ministry God's calling you to, right now. Are you making excuses so you can remain in your comfort zone?

Many of us come from little beginnings. That's no excuse to forget the passion God's placed within you. The qualities and abilities possessed by Daniel were also noted in several others (Dan 1:4-10). Yet he stood out as God began to use him (Dan 2:24-49). You may have the same qualification as others. What gift has God invested in you to make you stand out? Abraham never thought a nation will be birthed out of him.

Moses had plenty of excuses too (Exo 2:11-25; 3:1-4:17). We could always find excuses. To be at peace, we must decide to rise above them and take our place in God's path for us. God intended to pass his message on to the children of Israel directly, but they were too scared to draw near God (Ex 20:18-22). It's time to move forward and it's never too late.

You are more than you are and there's more than this (Matt 13:44-46). Don't limit yourself. You've stayed where you are for too long. Don't let fear stop you because with God, all things are possible (Matt 19:26). Whatever you think you can't do, God's given you the ability to do so much more and he's the only one that can satisfy.

Bottom line:

Naaman's blemish didn't stop him from becoming a revered commander, but how many excuses did he have to overcome before he sought the help he needed? May we begin to move beyond the blemishes in our lives and realise we're treasures in jars of clay (2 Cor 4:7). Let your life have impact and make a difference.
